Notice of Data Privacy Event

On July 15, 2022, Berkshire learned of suspicious activity impacting certain servers in Berkshire's environment. Upon learning of the suspicious activity, Berkshire promptly took steps to secure its systems and launched an investigation, with the assistance of third-party cyber security specialists, to determine the nature and scope of the event. Berkshire's investigation determined that certain files within its systems were accessed by an unauthorized actor.

After learning that certain files within its systems were accessed by an unauthorized actor, Berkshire began an in-depth and comprehensive review of the files to determine what information was contained within, and to whom the information relates. This extensive review is ongoing. At this time, there is no evidence or reports that information has been misused.

Berkshire will notify potentially affected individuals upon completion of the review of the files. Berkshire notified the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services and will continue to notify federal and state regulators as required. Berkshire takes this event and the security of the information in their care seriously. Although Berkshire had policies and procedures in place surrounding data security, Berkshire is reviewing their existing policies and procedures. Berkshire also notified federal law enforcement. Berkshire deeply regrets that this has occurred and sincerely apologizes for any inconvenience or concern it may have caused.

Berkshire encourages potentially impacted individuals to remain vigilant against incidents of identity theft and fraud, to review account statements, and to monitor their credit reports and explanation of benefits forms for suspicious activity. Notice of Data Privacy Event

Berkshire Farm Center & Youth Services (“Berkshire”) is providing notice of a recent data privacy event that may impact the privacy of a limited amount of information related to individuals. Berkshire is unaware of any misuse of individual information and is providing notice to potentially affected individuals with an abundance of caution.

On or about August 9, 2022, Berkshire became aware of suspicious activity relating to an employee’s email account. Berkshire immediately took steps to secure its email environment and launched an investigation, with the assistance of third-party specialists, to determine the nature and scope of the activity. Berkshire’s investigation determined that there was unauthorized access to the employee’s email account.

In an abundance of caution, Berkshire reviewed the contents of the email account to determine what information was contained within, and to whom the information relates. Berkshire then worked to gather address information for the potentially affected individuals in order to provide written notice of the event.

The types of information that may have been accessed or acquired by the unauthorized actor vary by individual. However, the information may have included: full name, and medical treatment information. At this time, Berkshire is unaware of any or actual or attempted misuse of the affected information as a result of this event.

Berkshire treats its duty to safeguard personal information as an utmost priority. Berkshire responded immediately to this event and worked diligently to provide potentially affected individuals with accurate and complete notice of the event as soon as possible. With the assistance of third-party specialists, Berkshire also took steps to review and enhance the security of its systems. As part of Berkshire’s ongoing commitment to the privacy and security of information in its care, Berkshire is reviewing existing policies and procedures to mitigate any risk associated with this event and to better prevent future events.

On October 6, 2022, Berkshire began notifying potentially impacted individuals and regulatory authorities, as required. Although Berkshire is unaware of the misuse of any personal information impacted by this event, individuals are encouraged to remain vigilant against incidents of identity theft by reviewing account statements, explanation of benefits, and monitoring free credit reports for suspicious activity and to detect errors. Any suspicious activity should be reported to the appropriate insurance company, healthcare provider, or financial institution.
